MISSION STATEMENT - DEPARTMENT OF ATHLETICS

The Mission of the Athletic Department of the College of the Holy Cross is to promote the intellectual, physical, and moral development of students. Through Division I athletic participation, our young men and women student-athletes learn a self-discipline that has both present and long-term effects; the interplay of individual and team effort; pride and self esteem in both victory and defeat; a skillful management of time; personal endurance and courage; and the complex relationships between friendship, leadership, and service. Our athletics program, in the words of the College Mission Statement, calls for "a community marked by freedom, mutual respect, and civility."

Besides teaching these virtues, a few sports played at Holy Cross have the added value of focusing alumni and student support and enhancing our reputation locally and nationally. While Holy Cross continues to commit itself to accomplishment in these sports, which are a rich part of our tradition, we choose to do so in a way that complements the pursuit of academic excellence.

Holy Cross is committed to the guiding principles of the Patriot League, of which we are a founding member: presidential control of athletics; the cultivation of the ideal scholar-athlete; and participation in a wide variety of sports. Commitment to the last principle assures that the College sponsors, in a very evident way, gender equity.

The department of athletics is also committed to compliance with all College policies and regulations involved in Division I membership in the National Collegiate Athletic Association and the Eastern College Athletic Conference. As a member of the NCAA, Holy Cross also advocates student-athlete welfare, diversity, gender equity, sportsmanship, and ethical conduct in its athletic programs.



CORRESPONDENCE

It is important for prospective student-athletes to get in touch with head coach Stephanie Pavlick as soon as possible. A simple letter of inquiry into the women’s lacrosse program will initiate the recruiting process. The spring of your junior year or early senior year is the most appropriate time to contact coach.

INTERVIEWS

Students are strongly encouraged to have admissions interviews. The office offers interviews from the summer until January 15. Alumni interviews in most metropolitan areas are available. Students must first submit an application and indicate they would like an alumni interview before December 31.

EARLY DECISION

Students who are absolutely, 100% confident Holy Cross is their top college choice are encouraged to apply during the Early Decision process.

FINANCIAL AID

All financial aid is awarded on the basis of need. Prospective student-athletes should complete the CSS “Profile Form” in early Fall.

CLEARINGHOUSE

The NCAA mandates that all student-athletes interested in competing at the Division I or II level must be certified through the NCAA Initial Eligibility Clearinghouse. Contact high school coaches, athletics director or guidance counselor for necessary registration forms.

CALENDAR:
A typical recruiting calendar for a prospective student-athlete interested in women’s lacrosse would go something like this:
** Summer of 2005 -- make unofficial visits to schools of interest.
** September 2005 -- contact Head Coach Stephanie Pavlick if Holy Cross falls within your top-five list of potential colleges.
** October of 2005 -- Head Coach Stephanie Pavlick will be in contact regarding student-athlete’s interest and possible visit date.
** December 15 -- Deadline for Admissions Early Decision.
** January 15 -- Deadline for Admissions Regular Decision.

December 15 - Early Decision
December 31- last day to request alumni interview (application needs to be postmarked by this date)
January 15 - Regular Decision
January 15 - last day for on-campus interviews

TELEPHONE CALLS

As per NCAA by law 13.1.3.1, institutional staff members may not telephone a prospect (or the prospect’s relatives or legal guardians) prior to July 1 following the prospect’s completion of the junior year in high school. After July 1, institutional staff members may telephone a prospect once per week (measured Sunday through Saturday). The once-per-week limit applies to the entire institution.

VIDEO TAPES

In an attempt to make an accurate assessment as soon as possible, it is recommended that videotapes be forwarded to Head Coach Stephanie Pavlick’s attention as soon as possible. The video need not be an elaborate production. Some simple game or practice tape is sufficient with you being easily identified.

CONTACTS

As per NCAA by law 13.02.3, a contact is any face-to-face encounter between a prospect or the prospect’s parent or legal guardian and an institutional staff member or athletics representative during which any dialogue occurs in excess of an exchange of a greeting. Any such face-to-face encounter that is prearranged or takes place on the grounds of the prospect’s high school, or at the site of organized competition or practice involving the prospect’s high school, preparatory school, two-year college, or all-star team is considered a contact, regardless of the conversation that occurs. We are limited to three off-campus contacts per prospective student-athlete.

EVALUATIONS

As per NCAA by law 13.02.6.1, an evaluation is any off-campus activity designed to assess the academic qualifications or athletic ability of a prospect, including any visit to a prospect’s educational institution (during which no contact occurs) or the observation of a prospect participating in any practice or competition at any size. We are limited in our number of evaluations per prospective student-athlete.

OFFICIAL VISITS

According to NCAA by law 13.7.1.2, a prospect may not make more than five expense-paid visits to NCAA member institutions, regardless of the number of sports in which the prospect is involved. An institution may not provide an expense-paid visit to a prospect who has not presented the institution with a high school (or college) academic transcript and a score from a PSAT, an SAT, a PACTPlus, or an ACT test taken on a national testing date under national testing conditions.

UNOFFICIAL VISITS

According to NCAA by law 13.8.1, a prospect may visit an institution’s campus at the prospect’s own expense an unlimited number of times and may make an unofficial visit before the prospect’s senior year in high school.



HEAD COACH STEPHANIE PAVLICK

FOURTH SEASON

Stephanie Pavlick is in her fourth season as head women’s lacrosse coach at Holy Cross. In 2005, she led Holy Cross to a second-place finish (4-2) in the Patriot League and the number two seed in the conference tournament. The Crusaders defeated third-seeded American, 11-10 in

the semifinals before falling to defending champion, Colgate in HC’s second-ever title game. The Crusaders’ 10-9 overall record was also one of just two winning records in the seven-team league in 2005.

In 2004, Pavlick coached HC to an 8-9 overall mark, and a fifth place finish in the Patriot League (2-4), after leading the Crusaders to a 7-9 (2-4 PL) record in her first year with the program.

Pavlick now owns a 33-45 career record, including her two year stint at Allegheny College in Pennsylvania where she directed the Gators to a record of 8-18 during the 2001 and 2002 seasons.

A 2000 graduate of the University of Massachusetts-Amherst, Pavlick brings NCAA Division I playing experience to the Crusaders. Pavlick led Massachusetts to the 2000 Atlantic 10 Conference Championship, the school’s first lacrosse title, and was the team’s leading scorer en route to earning Atlantic 10 All-Conference honors. As a senior, Pavlick tallied 35 goals and added six assists for 41 points to lead the Minutewomen’s effort. Pavlick was also named to the Atlantic 10 All-Academic team.

In the Atlantic 10 Championship game against Temple, Pavlick scored a pair of goals, including the game winner in overtime to give Massachusetts a 3-2 victory over the Owls. Pavlick served as team captain in 2000 and was voted the team’s Most Valuable Player following the season.

Pavlick was a three-year letterwinner while at Massachusetts and finished her career with 71 goals and 21 assists for 92 career points.



ASSISTANT COACH MEREDITH BUZZI

SECOND SEASON

Meredith Buzzi is in her second year as assistant coach for the women’s lacrosse program at Holy Cross. Buzzi is a 2003 graduate of Colby Sawyer College (New London, N.H.) where she was a four-year letterwinner

with the Chargers.

Buzzi tallied 87 goals and 41 assists, totalling 128 total points over the course of her career which is eighth best all-time in Colby Sawyer history. Her 41 assists were also good for third place all-time in school history, and her 87 goals currently serve as eighth best.

Buzzi served as team captain her senior year and recorded 34 goals and seven assists for 41 total points on her way to a Second Team

All-Commonwealth Coast Conference selection.

The Burlington, Vt. native was also named to the Colby Sawyer Academic Honor Roll in 2003. Buzzi earned a bachelor’s degree in Communication Studies.

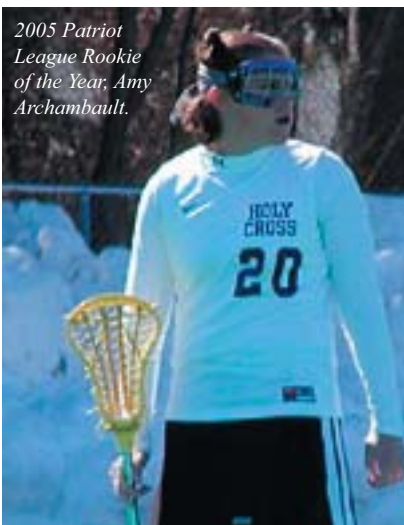

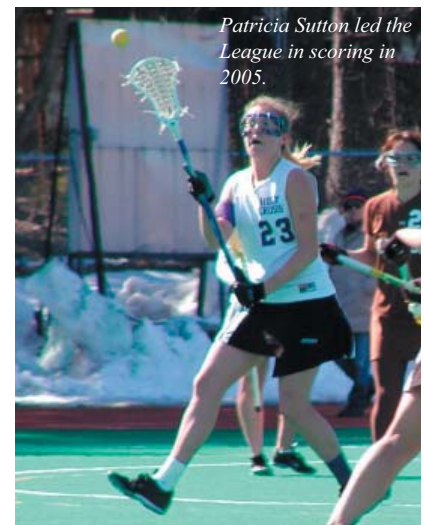

The Patriot League, which was founded on the principles of admitting athletes who are academically representative of their class, is in its second decade of academic and athletic achievement. Participation in athletics at Patriot League institutions is viewed as an important component of a well-rounded education.

The Patriot League began as a successful Division I-AA football conference in 1986. Full League members include American, Army, Bucknell, Colgate, Holy Cross, Lafayette, Lehigh and Navy. Associate members include Fordham (football), Georgetown (football) and Villanova (women's lacrosse).

These member institutions are among the oldest and most prestigious in the nation. Alumni from Patriot League colleges and universities have played a leadership role in the shaping of our country.

In the classroom, the League's full-member institutions, individually and collectively, consistently rank among the top Division I programs in the NCAA Graduation Rates Report. In the most recent report on NCAA Graduation Rates, the Patriot League ranked first among all Division I conferences in student-athlete graduation rates and second in overall student graduation rates.

League members have also distinguished themselves on the field of play. Patriot League sponsors championship competition in 23 sports (11 for men; 12 for women). Championship teams from 13 sports are guaranteed advancement into the NCAA Championships or CCA

play-in championships: baseball, men's and women's basketball, field hockey, football, men's golf, men's lacrosse, men's and women's soccer, softball, men's and women's tennis and volleyball.

In the league's history more than 150 teams have been selected for post-season play in the NCAA, ECAC or National Invitational tournaments. The League also boasts 55 student-athletes who have qualified for NCAA Championships, the pinnacle of collegiate individual competition. A total of 155 Patriot League student-athletes have earned all-America honors.

During the past three academic years, 53 of the Patriot League's 66 Scholar-Athletes of the Year also received All-League status for their exemplary athletic performance. Additionally, 9 of the Scholar-Athletes honored were named Players of the Year or Performers of the Meet in their respective sport.

In the league's history, 121 Patriot League student-athletes have been recognized as CoSIDA Academic All-Americans, while more than 8,000 more have qualified for the League's Academic Honor Roll by accumulating a 3.2 grade-point average and earning a varsity letter. Twenty-three student-athletes have received NCAA Postgraduate Scholarships. Additionally, Patriot League student-athletes have earned two Fulbright Scholarships, a Luce Foundation Scholarship, a Marshall Scholarship, two NACDA/Disney Scholarships, four National Football Foundation Scholarships and three ECAC/Robbins Scholar-Athlete of the Year awards among their many accomplishments.
